



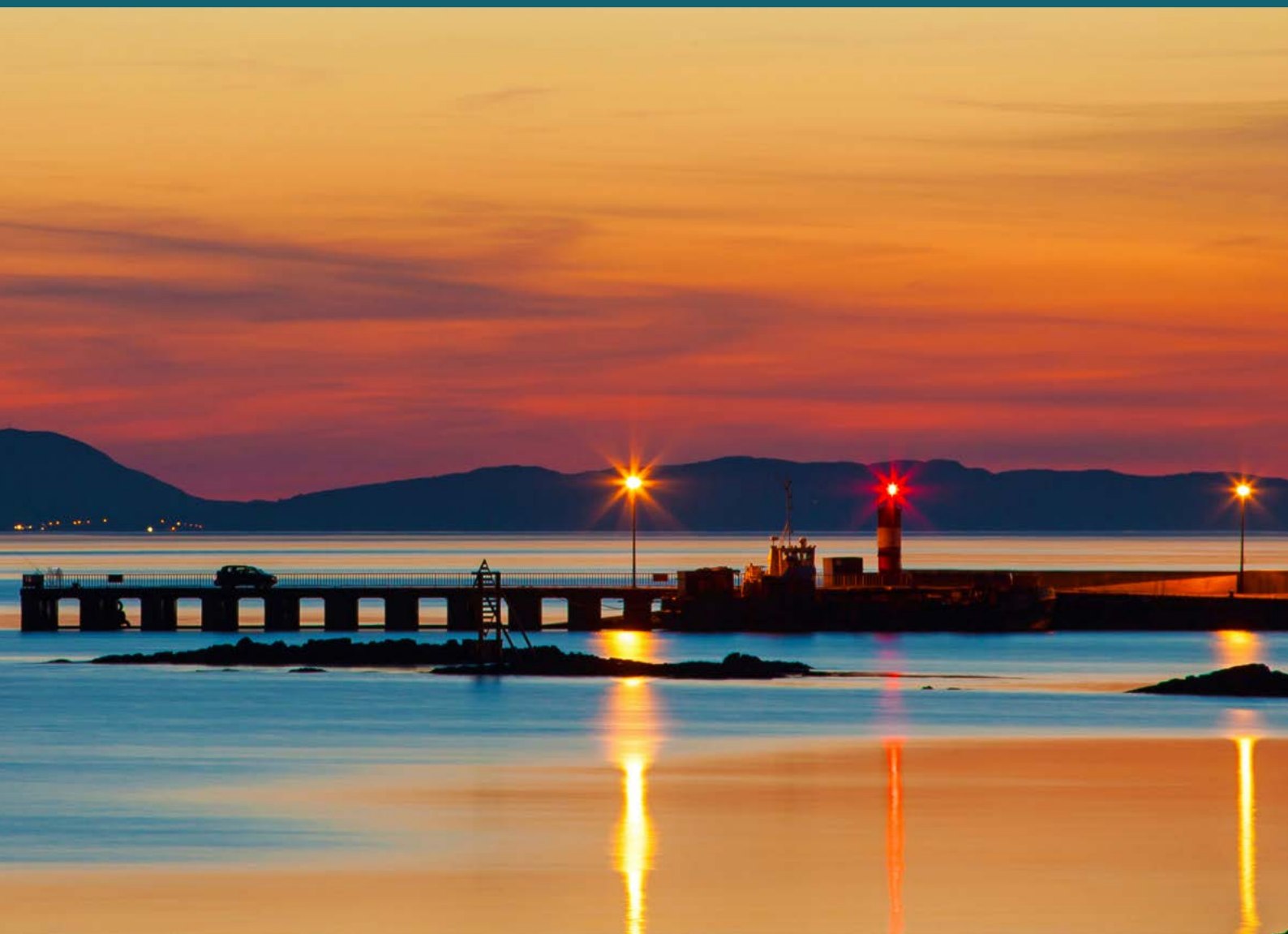

Executive Summary

This Town Team Action Plan seeks to be a catalyst for Buncrana's continued development into a vibrant, well-connected socio-economic hub over the next 15 years. As a strategically important town in the North West City Region (NWCRC), Buncrana faces unique opportunities and challenges. The Buncrana Town Team proposes to build on local assets and community spirit, together with national policies, to revitalise the town through sustainable economic, social, and environmental initiatives.

Our Action Plan responds to the needs and suggestions from our community, identifying priorities for development over the short, medium and long term. Key areas of focus include enhancing public infrastructure, fostering economic diversification, promoting sustainable practices, and strengthening community engagement and collaboration.

Established in 2024, the Buncrana Town Team has developed this Action Plan through consultation, strategic planning, and stakeholder engagement. The plan builds on the town's strengths – its natural environment, community spirit, and tourism potential – while identifying the needs and priorities of the local community. It sets out a vision for the future and identifies a series of targeted approaches and projects.

The plan is created for everyone with an interest in the future development of the town, including residents, local groups and businesses, the local authority, central government, and private developers – as well as those who work in and visit Buncrana. As a “non-statutory plan”, this provides a vision and framework for future developments that is not legally binding but will be used to inform decision-making, secure funding and help to prioritise projects.

The plan takes into account existing projects, plans and potential redevelopment initiatives for Buncrana including:

- > “Repowering Buncrana” led by Donegal County Council, which includes redevelopment of the old Garda Barracks and a proposed ambitious development of the Shore Front stretching from the Pier to the Fishing Greens and connecting the Shore Front with Buncrana Main Street.
- > Buncrana Regeneration Strategy and Action Plan – led by Donegal County Council, which will take into consideration the Town Team Action Plan and feedback from the local community.
- > The proposed redevelopment of the Leisure Centre/Swimming Pool
- > IDP's Eco Buncrana Strategy
- > The recently launched Buncrana Night-Time Economy Action Plan 2025-2026
- > IDP's proposed Social Innovation Hub

The Buncrana Town Team aims to be a collaborative advocate for positive change for the benefit of the town by laying out a detailed Action Plan to include:

1. **Enhanced Public Infrastructure:** Supporting comprehensive transport systems and modernised infrastructure and utilities to support sustainable growth.
2. **Economic Diversification:** Encouraging a mixed economy with opportunities in technology, arts, and sustainable industries.
3. **Strengthened Community Engagement:** Fostering collaborative approaches and inclusive decision-making processes.

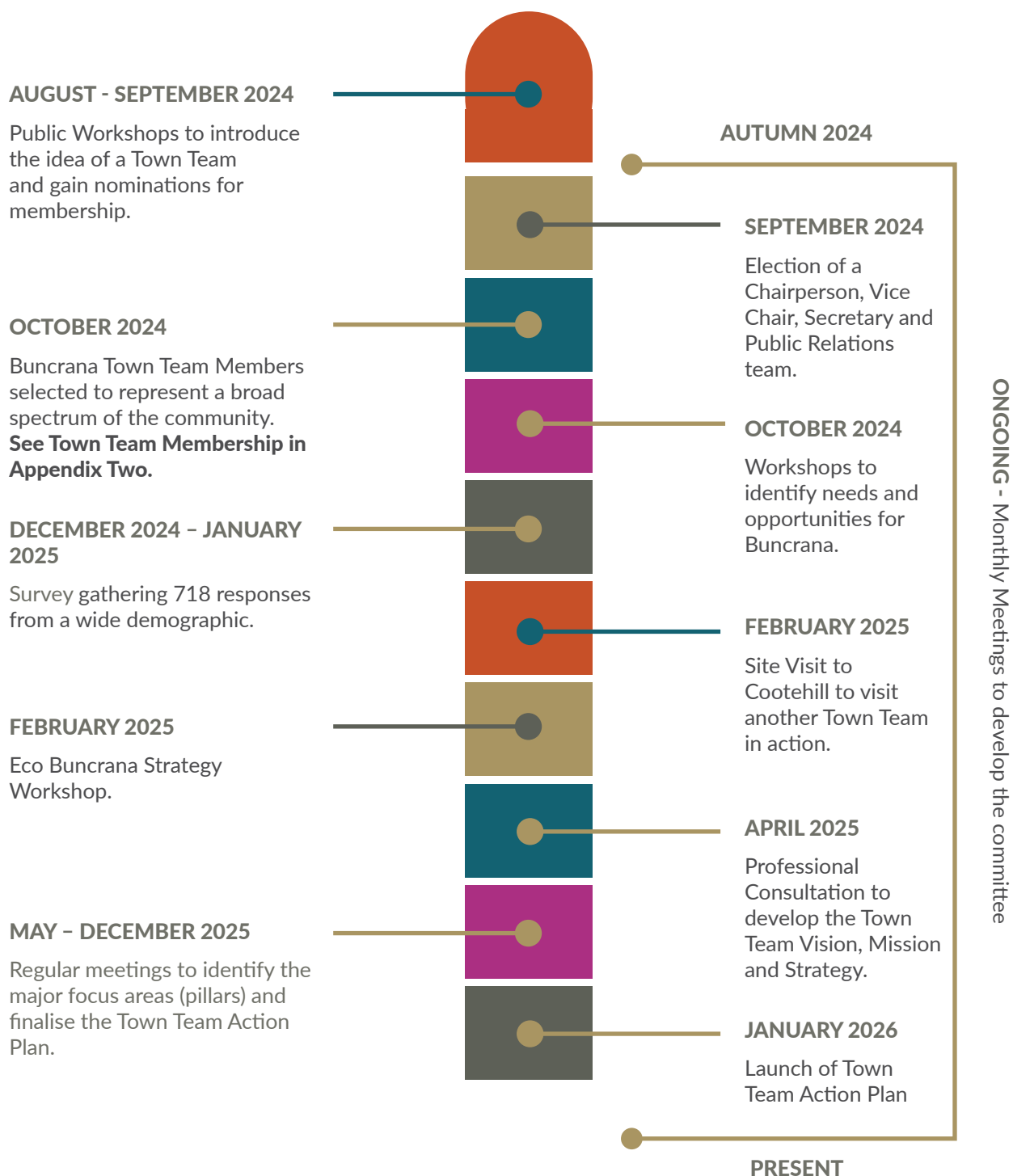
Background

Buncrana Town Team is one of several Town Teams in Donegal, established by the local authority in 2024 to respond to community and business needs in the town and its hinterland. Town Teams create the opportunity and space to bring together people and groups who represent a wide spectrum of stakeholders. Town Teams act as catalysts to encourage businesses, local communities and others to work together to energise and reinvigorate their towns and communities in collaboration with public authorities and other service providers.

The Town Team's Vision of Buncrana in 2040

- > In 2040, Buncrana will be a thriving socio-economic hub powered by renewable energy, with a mixed economy of large industrial employment and new generation SMEs in arts, fashion, sustainable construction, design and food. Buncrana's tourism potential will be realised with state-of-the-art facilities that enhance the area's rich culture and heritage and make the most of the natural environment.
- > Buncrana will have a range of contemporary leisure facilities serving the whole community and promoting health and wellbeing through leisure, sport and the arts.
- > Buncrana will have an internationally recognised innovation and training centre, specialising in sustainable industry, construction and renewables.
- > Buncrana town will have a vibrant, diverse and safe night-time economy which enhances the experience of residents and visitors alike. It will feel safe to all, and the Buncrana community spirit will be visible and palpable.
- > Buncrana will be devoid of dereliction, and the town centre and industrial buildings will be re-developed in innovative ways. Heritage-driven regeneration will preserve the building stock of the town in a modern urban regeneration setting.
- > Buncrana town will be easy to move around with innovative community transport systems based on the mobility needs of people of all ages and abilities. Buncrana will seek to be connected to the North West City Region Light Rail Network, which will reconnect and serve all the settlements of the North West. This will support commuting between Derry, Strabane, Letterkenny and Inishowen and provide wider connectivity to other major regional centres on both sides of the border.
- > The town will embrace the Swilly, with a vibrant water-based and marine economy, and an all-seasons water transport link across Lough Swilly.
- > Youth facilities will be run by the young people of Buncrana, who are empowered in social enterprise skills and have a significant democratic voice which is heard, listened to and engaged with in policy making and future developments for the town.

Buncrana Town Team commits to:

- > Establishing an interactive forum for advocacy, partnership and exchange with decision-makers and service delivery bodies to advance the needs of Buncrana and encourage collaboration between different agencies and providers.
- > Ensuring ongoing effective information exchange on investment opportunities from Government and other sources.
- > Working collectively with relevant partners to mobilise and align funding and investment opportunities with Buncrana's documented development needs.
- > Drawing on all available networks and communication channels to raise Buncrana's profile as a strong proposition for investment and ensuring that this is reflected in planning and economic and social development strategies at local, county, regional and national levels.
- > Reviewing emerging evidence and ensuring that this is emphasised in promoting delivery of the vision for Buncrana in 2040, considering academic, policy-related, technical, and community research.
- > Recognising that nothing stays the same and responding with flexibility to prioritise or re-prioritise actions from time to time.
- > Building and retaining strong links with different key stakeholders in the town, peninsula, county and region, as well as nationally, and at EU and wider international levels.
- > Developing a communications plan to ensure strategic, clear and regular communication with the community, with agencies and other interested parties.

Context

Buncrana is the largest seaside town in County Donegal, the second-largest town in the county and a key settlement within the North West City Region (NWCRC), which includes Derry, Strabane, and Letterkenny.

The Buncrana Town Team Survey Report and other research documents such as IDP's Social Innovation Hub Buncrana Scoping Paper, Eco Strategy Document, Buncrana Night-Time Economy Plan, etc., all point to key strengths and assets of the town.

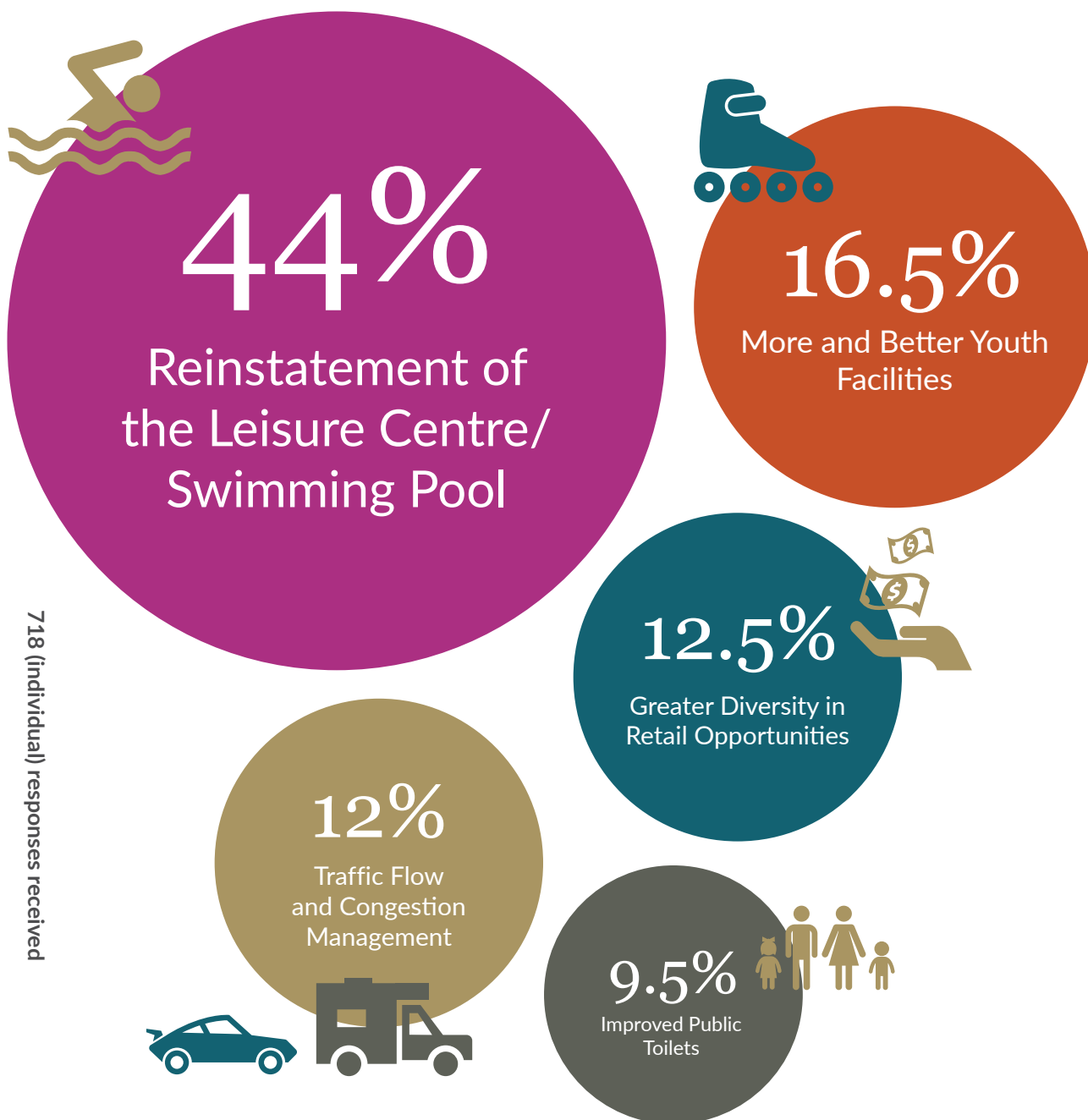
Buncrana's Strengths and Assets

- > **Natural Environment:** The town's seaside location and natural environment are consistently highlighted as key assets. The vision for Buncrana in 2040 emphasises harmony between the natural environment, culture, heritage, and wellbeing and a vibrant water-based and marine economy, e.g., the Crana River and the Mill River have potential for a hydro-electric scheme. The scenery, coastline and location help to make Buncrana a great place to live and work according to almost half of the respondents to the Town Team Survey.
- > **Cultural and Heritage Resources:** Buncrana is noted for its distinctive industrial heritage and the potential for heritage-driven regeneration to preserve its building stock.
- > **Community Spirit:** Buncrana's community spirit is visible and palpable. The Town Team model itself is an important mechanism for ensuring local leadership and cross-community representation. The Town Team's research also highlights Buncrana's people and community spirit as key assets.
- > **Tourism Potential:** Buncrana is a popular holiday destination and has been welcoming visitors for generations both as a seaside town and the "gateway to Inishowen".

"Buncrana has it all: beautiful scenery, great walks, beaches, hills and parks, with Swan Park a magnificent amenity. Buncrana was described by a travel writer in the 19th century as "Parthás Éireann", Ireland's Paradise. Challenges and Considerations for Implementation

- > **Funding and Resource Allocation:** While significant national funds exist, securing adequate and consistent funding remains a critical challenge.
- > **Coordination and Integration:** It is essential to ensure a more integrated and coordinated approach to development across various investment programmes and between local groups.
- > **Legal and Governance Structures:** Establishing appropriate legal management structures for development initiatives is vital to ensure good governance, integrity and transparency.
- > **Data Gaps:** While data collection is emphasised, addressing gaps in existing data and developing a consistent research programme will be vital.
- > **Sustainability:** Ensuring the long-term sustainability of initiatives, including funding and operational models, is crucial.

Next Steps

To advance the Buncrana Town Team Action Plan, the following steps are proposed.

Step 01

Strategic Partnerships

Forge alliances with local authorities, businesses, and community groups to facilitate coordinated efforts.

Step 02

Funding Applications

Secure financial support through national, regional, European and international funding programmes.

Step 03

Implementation Planning

Develop detailed project timelines and resource allocation strategies.

Step 04

Monitoring and Evaluation

Establish a robust framework for tracking progress and adapting strategies as needed.

Conclusion

This Action Plan outlines proposed actions and ideas across various sectors to improve Buncrana. It details suggestions from our wide consultations and conversations, keeping inclusion and community at the centre. There is an emphasis on sustainability and environmental concerns as well as the need for investment in regeneration and amenities. This is underpinned by national policies like Town Centre First and Our Rural Future.

The Buncrana Town Team supports Buncrana as it stands at a pivotal point for regeneration. The Town Team's plan is about building on what has started already, such as the Night-Time Economy initiative, Repowering Buncrana and the Rural Regeneration project, as well as the background work done on a possible Social Innovation Hub.

The vision for Buncrana in 2040 is ambitious, focusing on a sustainable, vibrant, and well-connected town that leverages its natural, cultural, and community assets. Successful implementation will require sustained collaborative efforts, strategic investment, robust governance, and a continuous focus on addressing the identified needs and aspirations of its community.

The online survey received 718 individual responses.

Q: What is great about Buncrana?

With **688 comments**, it was clear that people were excited to share what is great about Buncrana.

- > People & Community: 187 responses
- > Location & Scenery: 332 responses
- > Buncrana Tidy Towns: 18 responses
- > Amenities: 14 responses
- > Everything: 9 responses
- > N/A or Nothing: 11 responses

Q: What would you like to improve about Buncrana?
